Emmy award-winner

Two-time Emmy Award winner Michael Olmert plans on keeping his "Screenwriting" workshop simple during this year's F. Scott Fitzgerald Literary Conference on Saturday, Oct. 14, at Montgomery College.

Olmert, the author of four books, two plays and more than 80 TV documentaries, is a professor of English at the University of Maryland and said he is honored to be included in this year's conference lineup.

which includes four Pulitzer Prize winners (see story on FOTA page I) and a legacy of other award winning writers.

But for Olmert, who has - Michael Olmert, two-time worked with actors Richard Dreyfuss, Stockard Channing and Martin Sheen to name a few, the key to his workshop is simplicity.

"It's guaranteed to be fun," Olmert said. "We will look at movies and see what they [participants] like. The key to screenwriting is that it has to be as natural as possible. It's drama. That is what people want."

Olmert also will emphasize three main elements of screenwriting: Words, music and images.

"Screenwriting is never a speech or an essay." Olmert said.

Many times writers have a point of view to get across, but words alone do not cut it, Olmert said. To be effective, the work should be surprising and unpredictable in

Olmert is one of the workshop leaders who will accept sample manuscripts from participants the day of the conference.

Also accepting manuscripts is "Mystery" workshop leader Marcia Talley, an Agatha and Anthony Award winning author. The Mystery workshop is new to the F. Scott Fitzgerald Literary Conference this year and is

expected to be quite popular.

Also new to the Conference is Katharine Davis, who will lead the "Midlife Writing/Late Bloomers" workshop, and C.M. Mayo, who will lead a workshop on 'Travel Writing."
